eSwatini (formerly known as Swaziland) is the last true monarchy in Africa, ruled by King Mswati III and has a population of around 1.2 million people. The United Pentecostal Church has had a presence in this country since pioneer missionaries Mack & Bobbie Carpenter arrived in 1982 and as of 2021 there were 23 established churches or preaching points, with 29 licensed ministers and over 4,100 active church members with those numbers growing as souls are added to the Kingdom of God daily!



Since our arrival to eSwatini on October 9th, Kyle has preached at a men's conference, taught in the Bible School, and led Friday evening prayer service, and Heather has taught Sunday School. We are already seeing lives changed and are excited for the future of the church in this great nation!

As we we are soon coming to the end of our first year in missions, our current need is finding a place to call "home" for the first couple of months when we return to the states to travel and raise the funding to return to the field. Please keep us in prayer during this time of transition.
