In the first week of October, we traveled to the heart of Guyana, Mahdia. Our small team of ministers and saints endeavored to share the Apostolic truth in communities that had never heard this message. Missionary Steve Smith led the way with his teaching and preaching to the people in the town of Mahdia and the village of Micobie. In Micobie there were 8 baptized in the Potaro River after Bro. Smith gave a short 10-minute declaration on the essentiality of Jesus Name baptism. In Mahdia there were 4 that received the gift of the Holy Ghost for the first time, several people were refilled with the Holy Ghost, and 6 were baptized in an old freezer that was filled with water

as there was a water shortage. Pastor Victor Hernandez Jr., a former trinitarian pastor in Mahdia who left to help his father pastor in Mabaruma, revisited his congregation in Mahdia and was moved by God and his burden for the people to stay behind to lead the congregation to the truth of God's word. There is now a church in the heart of Guyana that preaches the Apostolic Doctrine, where there was none. Praise Jesus! After returning from Mahdia, we were blessed by Bro. Bradt and his ministry where we had revival services, bible school sessions, and men's meeting. Since then, we have been working hard during the day at constructing the Bible School. We finished the ceiling on both floors and most of the electrical wire has been run. At night we have been teaching Wednesday night bible study, helping with the youth Christmas pageant, and anything that we can do to be a blessing in Guyana. We are also rejoicing for the amazing things that are happening in Paramaribo, Suriname. Pastor Geneva Nooitmeer has reported 4 people that have received the Holy Ghost for the first time. We are incredibly blessed to be with such wonderful soldiers of God in both Guyana and Suriname.
