Here was a place to showcase the majesty of the Creator and all of His power but the concept of church had been obliterated to a mere photo-opportunity.

With understanding that this location did not dictate whether or not truth would be preached in Iceland we prayed that God would resurrect the dead things that once did call on His name and that the winds would blow from all directions and breathe life into the dry bones.
