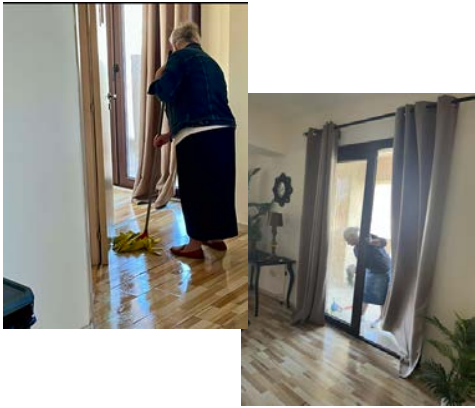

Adapting to a new language,, navigating markets and stores, trying unfamiliar cuisines, and developing sensitivity when meeting local Cypriots, have all been part of this learning experience.
